The Recipe Corner, by Dorothy Shaner Scampi Rossi – quick seafood dish

My mother gave me this recipe in 1974. It serves four people. Serve with a nicely flavored rice dish. We just make it for 2 people using a scant 1 pound of shrimp and adjusting downward the rest of the ingredients by 1/3 (you need the extra flavor).

2 lbs shelled and de-veined fresh shrimp

1/3 cup olive oil

½ cup extra dry vermouth (Martini is the better choice)

2 cloves crushed garlic

³/₄ teaspoon salt (these days, I'd use kosher salt and less of it)

½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper (these days, I'd use more)

3 tablespoons minced parsley

2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Cook shrimp in hot olive until they begin to turn pink. Add vermouth, salt, pepper. Cook until liquid is nearly gone, being careful not to overcook shrimp. Sprinkle with parsley and lemon juice and serve.
