Lucy Moore is president of Lucy Moore Associates, Inc. which provides mediation, facilitation, consultation and training services in the fields of natural resource and public policy dispute resolution. Recently her focus has been on water issues, air quality, hazardous waste disposal, endangered species, and tribal issues. Her ability to communicate across a variety of barriers allows solutions to emerge despite complicated issues.
