The Fire, the Future and Recreation

Kimberly DeVall will talk about "Recreational Opportunities on the Valles Caldera National Preserve". In her words, "the Valles Caldera National Preserve offers a variety of recreational opportunities for the public. Summertime opportunities include hiking, fishing, mountain biking, equestrian trails, van tours, marathon, and lots of other special events. Wintertime opportunities include cross-country skiing and snowshoeing on over 30 miles of groomed trails and horse-drawn wagon or sleigh rides." Kimberly DeVall serves as the recreation specialist for the Valles Caldera Trust. Since she began in July 2008, she has explored ways to increase recreational experiences on the Preserve, implemented the hiking shuttle program, and re-vamped the interpretative programs offered to the public. Prior to working for the Trust, she was the education coordinator for the Respect the Rio program on the Santa Fe National Forest.

Marla Rogers will present An Overview of the Las Conchas Fire and Its effects on the Valles Caldera National Preserve. She has worked as the Fire Management Officer for the Valles Caldera National Preserve since March, 2011. Previously, Marla worked for the National Park Service for over 20 years in locations from California to Florida. Most recently she served as the Assistant Fire Management Officer for Bandelier National Monument from 2002 until taking on the new opportunity at the Valles Caldera earlier this year.

## **\$tart \$mart at UNM-LA**

Our branch will partner with AAUW-NM, UNM-Los Alamos and Phi Theta Kappa to bring a salary negotiation workshop, called \$tart \$mart, to the local campus of UNM Friday morning, November 4. The branch and state officers are excited to make this announcement as this will be the first \$tart \$mart Workshop in New Mexico.

Several years ago AAUW research called "Behind the Wage Gap" showed that one year out of college the wage gap between men and women working full time with the same college degree, was already 20%. Ten years after graduation male college graduates were making on average 30% more than their female classmates. Why? One of the reasons pointed out by the study was that women only rarely negotiate for a higher starting salary while it is common with men. This workshop open to men and women shows students how to research and then ask for what they are worth.

The three-hour \$tart \$mart Workshop was designed by the Wage Project and will be provided at no cost to the students. Our own AAUW-NM Co-President Shelley Rossback will be the trainer. The community college honorary fraternity, Phi Theta Kappa, has agree to be the campus sponsor. Their faculty liaison is our branch member Maryjane Giesler.
