### **IN MEMORIUM**

Dr. Marjorie Bell Chambers, a charter of member of the Los Alamos Branch of AAUW, died at age 83, on August 22, 2006 after a long illness. She was also Past AAUW President of New Mexico ('55-'57) and Past National AAUW President ('77-'81). Marjorie Bell was an educator, historian, activist, politician and the first woman to run for lieutenant governor in New Mexico. She was a strong advocate for women's rights and education, making this her lifelong mission. A memorial service was held at the United Church of Los Alamos on August 28, 2006 at 2:PM. She leaves behind many AAUW and other friends in Los Alamos and her husband, Bill Chambers, 336 Andanada, and family.

The League of Women Voters has invited us to attend the September 14<sup>th</sup> open membership meeting. The speaker is Dick Mason. Dick will speak on health care reform both in New Mexico and elsewhere. He moved to Albuquerque from Massachusetts and knows a lot about that recent legislation. He has become very active in NM in several health care reform coalitions, of which LWVNM is a member. The meeting will be at Fuller Lodge; finger food and desserts at 6:30, speaker at 7:30.

AAUW and the League of Women Voters are cosponsoring two candidate forums: September 21 at Fuller Lodge, 6:30-9 PM for county council candidates only, and October 4, also at Fuller Lodge, 6:30-9 PM for all local candidates.

### **National News:**

The National AAUW 125th birthday celebration will be on Tuesday, November 25.

Three AAUW LAF plaintiffs found success in pay equity claims recently, with the support and help of LAF. The first case involved Lucinda Miller, former professor of pharmacy practice, and Elaine King-Miller, former associate dean for outcome management at the University. Miller sued Texas Tech for sex discrimination, denial of tenure and retaliation for complaints about the discrimination and pay inequity in violation of the Equal Pay Act. King-Miller sued for pay inequity. A jury found in favor of Miller and King-Miller's Equal Pay Act claims and awarded them \$58,000 combined in lost wages.

The third plantiff, Lynn deMartin, former director of the Santa Fe Center at NM Highlands University, sued the school for sex discrimination in pay, race discrimination, and retaliation for her complaints, resulting in wrongful termination. Several ensuing settlement conferences failed. The day AAUW LAF informed deMartin that it would support her case the University made a generous settlement offer.
