Deborah Simon Water, Girls and Education in Guatemala Tuesday, February 21, 7:30 p.m. Bethlehem Lutheran Church Welcoming Hall

Deborah Simon will be speaking on the subject of how the lack of access to clean water can affect the ability of girls to attend school in developing countries.

Deborah has an interesting biography. She was raised in the rural area of Guatemala. At a young age she recognized the need for medical care and made the decision to become a nurse. Deborah came to the United States to finish high school and then graduated from the University of Oregon with a nursing degree. She moved to Espanola in 1982 and, with her husband Tom, raised a family. Deborah is currently a home health care nurse at the Espanola Hospital.

Deborah has been a member of medical teams to Guatemala for the past 12 years. She has coordinated Rotary projects since 1997 and each year takes a volunteer team to project sites. A number of **Los Alamos volunteers** have participated on these teams. In 2004 she founded United by Friendship, a non-profit organization devoted to humanitarian projects in Central America.
