Jorg Jansen And New Life Blossoms from the Ruins Tuesday, October 20, 7:30pm Bethlehem Lutheran Church

Mr Jansen, author of <u>And New Life Blossoms from the Ruins</u>, will share his memories of growing up in World War II Germany during the turbulent years 1939 to 1949. He will describe his war experiences as an 8 to 14 year old. Later as a teenager, he witnessed the change from dictatorship to democracy.

Jorg Jansen was born 1930 in Mulheim on the southern flank of the Ruhr Basin. To escape wartime aerial bombardments, he and his family relocated from his still-intact hometown to Waldenburg in Silesia, a region situated in parts of present-day Poland, the Czech Republic, and Germany. When the Soviet army marched on Silesia, Jansen made his way back to his hometown only to find that much of it had been destroyed by bombs. Only after the Marshall Plan was implemented did the region's economy improve and new life begin to blossom, he said, adding, "Very gradually, the hope for a better future began to replace the despair of mere survival."

He studied electrical engineering in Aachen, and taught in Aachen, in Loughborough (UK) and later in Santiago (Chile). In 1960 he went to America for one or two years to explore the then far advanced solid state technologies. He joined the Laboratory in 1975, where he headed the Laser Fusion project "Antares," the Laser Isotope Separation project "Phoenix," and the Strategic Defense (Star Wars) project "GTA." Forty eight years later and still in the US after an exciting career in engineering research and development, he lives now with his wife Brigit in retirement in Los Alamos.

He wrote his book to remind his family and friends that war knows no mercy. In its blindness it destroys the lives of civilians and soldiers alike.
