Rancho Chimayo will be decorated for the holidays, and, for the third year, AAUW will meet there for our holiday luncheon and service project. This year the Coordinating Council asks each member to bring CASH or sturdy fresh fruit that does not require refrigeration, such as apples, oranges, clementines or pears. A committee will use cash donations to purchase additional fresh fruit and will prepare festive bags to be placed in each box distributed by LA Cares during their monthly food distribution on December 13th. LA Cares normally prepares about ninety individualized boxes of staples, which include very little fresh fruit or vegetables. We are asking for CASH not checks so that the money can be spent on fruit to provide a holiday treat for the recipients. Checks would have to be turned over to the LA Cares board, and AAUW would have no control over what is purchased with our donation.

A representative from the LA Cares Board of Directors will talk to us about the services they provide county residents and will answer questions. When you hear about the hundreds of hours donated each month by LA Cares volunteers, the Council is sure you will be glad to help.

Results of Our Program Survey

We received 28 completed surveys, which is one less than 50% of our current membership. It is interesting that having programs on Saturday with lunch was chosen by more than 70% of respondents. Thursday evening was next most popular.

Local Authors ranked as the number one program choice with Entertainment and International Issues tying for second. Third place was shared by Black/Native/Hispanic speakers and Women's Health Issues.

No proposed branch activity received half or more of respondents' support. Surprisingly, Women's

History Month Activity and Volunteer Opportunities in the Schools received the most support, even though we have not held either activity in recent years.

Our branch membership supports AAUW's Pro-Choice position by an overwhelming 85%. See page 4 of this newsletter for full survey results.

The Council and new Program Committee will take all of this information into consideration as we plan branch programs for the remainder of the year. AAUW Brings Tech Trek to New Mexico

AAUW Las Cruces was recently honored to win one of three grants given by AAUW to hold a Tech Trek Summer Camp for 8th grade girls during the summer of 2014. The camp will be planned in conjunction with the Young Women in Computing (YWiC) program at NMSU and will, therefore, have an emphasis on technology as well as the other STEM fields. The camp will be open to girls rising into 8th grade from throughout New Mexico. Throughout the week, girls will attend a daily math or science core class, participate in focused workshops, perform hands-on activities, attend a field trip to a STEM work environment and meet female STEM role models.

Tech Trek NM will be held July 13-19 on the NMSU campus. Outreach to New Mexico middle school principals and science/math teachers is underway. The recruitment process requires that students are first nominated by their science or math teacher. The nominations are due by February 14. Seventh grade science and math teachers throughout New Mexico will be sent nomination materials or they can be requested at

techtreklc@gmail.com. Students nominated will then be invited to fill out an application, including an essay, which is due by March 7. The Selection Committee will conduct an initial selection process, and designate potential participants who will then be interviewed along with their family. As much as possible, the interviews are to be conducted in person, so AAUW branches throughout the state will assist with this crucial aspect of the process. There is a very specific set of interview questions, along with a recommended Scoring Rubric. The final selection process will take place in early April, with selected campers being notified by April 11. More information on the interview committee and how you can participate will be coming in a few months.
