Our branch welcomes several new members this year. Here are introductions in their own words.

#### **Dorothy C. Donnelly-Shaner:**

Dorothy Donnelly Shaner (or just Dorothy Shaner) moved to Los Alamos with her husband, John Shaner, in 2002. For many years, Dorothy taught part- and full-time Political Science (American foreign policy, international relations and organizations, American politics) at small private colleges. Her longest and best tenure was at Chatham College in Pittsburgh, PA. After winning a Foster Fellowship at the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency in 1985, Dorothy went to Washington, DC for two years. After Jim Donnelly died in 1987, she made the Washington, DC location permanent and took a tenured government position in arms control-related issues at the U.S. Department of Energy. She was involved in a variety of arms control issues prominent at the time, most notably the United States nuclear testing program. From 1993 through 1997 Dorothy served as the DOE Member on the U.S. delegation to the 60-nation Conference on Disarmament in Geneva. That Clinton-directed team successfully negotiated a Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban

Treaty (CTBT- never ratified) and attempted unsuccessfully to negotiate a Fissile Material Cutoff Treaty. Dorothy returned to Washington in late 1997 and retired from DOE in early 2002. After moving to Los Alamos, with DOE financial support and using laboratory facilities, Dorothy wrote a classified monograph on the very private negotiations between the Permanent Five (U.S., UK, France, China, Russia) on the CTBT. Dorothy lives in White Rock with John, a retired Los Alamos Fellow and physicist. They like to cook and travel. She has two grown daughters and two grandchildren, all living in the East.

#### Deepa Nadiga

I was born and raised in India. I lived in North India through high school and moved to South India to complete Medical School. I married Balu and moved to the United States. I did my internship in Psychiatry at the University of Wisconsin at Madison (combining it with a pregnancy for a really crazy year). After the birth of my oldest son, I moved to Albuquerque to complete my residency at the University of New Mexico. Busy years followed, with the birth of my second son, working as faculty at UNM and devouring breakfast burritos.
