MANA del Norte Scholarship Fund



State News

Helena Whyte announced that AAUW-NM is applying for an impact grant from national AAUW at the urging of national people who were at the state convention in Las Vegas. The impact grant will focus on the NM Fair Pay Act, the thrust being to educate both businesses and workers, especially women, on what this legislation means. Their plan is to hold public forums in Santa Fe, Las Cruces, and Albuquerque; a single page handout summarizing the law and providing resources would be available at these forums. They are currently looking for partners for this endeavor as well as for a test case. The second thrust of the impact grant would involve getting out the vote and the third thrust efforts to educate the public either on STEM or the Common Core standards.
