The Title IX Champion award recognizes the vital Title IX advocacy of AAUW supporters across the country. Helena was recognized for promoting gender equity in women's sports and education. Two years ago she formed the branch's Title IX Support Group to encourage attendance at local girls' athletic events. A schedule of Los Alamos High School girls' home games was published in our newsletter and members attended one or two games each month. They also carpooled to attend women's games at nearby colleges, including UNM in Albuquerque. In addition, Helena was the creator of the NM Online Branch and always included articles and links to women's sporting news on its website. She was nominated for her exemplary role in supporting Title IX equity.

The Los Alamos Branch is pleased to announce that in June we surpassed our \$20,000 goal for the Jean Nereson Books Memorial, which honors long-time branch member Jean Nereson, who died two years ago. The fund is administered by the Los Alamos Public Schools Foundation and will provide \$1,000 each year for four years to each elementary school library in the district for new printed media. Jean is fondly remembered for teaching 52 years in the Los Alamos elementary schools and for her enthusiastic leadership and support for all branch activities.

As of Aug. 15, \$20,496.50 has been donated to the fund, says LAPS Foundation Executive Director, Joanna Gillespie. Donations continue to be accepted, and all money will be spent for books for Los Alamos elementary school libraries promises Gillespie.
