Judy Prono will comment on Caroline Henderson's writings about farming in the Oklahoma Panhandle during the 1930s at both meetings. The library has a dozen copies of Egan's book for checkout. Matching-Funds Campaign for Tech Trek-NM

Our Branch AAUW fundraiser this year will support the Tech Trek camp to be held in July at NM Highlands University in Las Vegas. AAUW-NM needs to raise \$28,000 to enable 32 girls to attend this summer STEM camp. We are offering to match up to \$1000 in donations from Branch members to help fund the camp. The deadline for donations is March 1.

The matching funds for this campaign will come from LANL contributions to our Branch in recognition of volunteer work done by Branch members who are Lab retirees and from pledges by Council members. Holding the Tech Trek camp in Las Vegas this summer will enable more girls from northern New Mexico to attend. We will be working to see that 7th-grade girls at Los Alamos Middle School are aware of the camp and encouraged to apply. The camp provides a summer learning program that highlights educational and career opportunities in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). It nurtures girls' interest in these fields by introducing them to both peers and professional women with similar interests.
