





Equal Pay Day Tabling Event LA Farmers' Market, Fuller Lodge April 9th, 8-12:30

Equal Pay Day is the symbolic day when women who have worked all of the previous year and up until this day finally earn the same pay made by men who worked all of the previous year. This year the (un)celebration is designated April 14 to represent that in 2013 (the last year with complete data) women on average working full-time, year-round made 78% of what men earned. Our branch will use this opportunity to educate both the public and members with a table at the last winter Farmer's Market, Thursday, April 9 at Fuller Lodge, 8am - 12:30 pm.

The table will be filled with information about the Gender Pay Gap, and every interested person is welcome to a copy of the 2015 edition of "The Simple Truth." This booklet shows in words and graphs the demographics of the gender pay gap that affects all ethnicities, states, educational levels, and career paths. Stop by our table and pick up a copy for yourself, your niece, your granddaughter and every interested working woman you know.

This public event will also serve as a branch membership drive.
