Following the business meeting and presentation of interest groups, we will enjoy lunch (\$15) catered by Ruby K's. After lunch, our program begins with video clips of Tech Trek activities at New Mexico Highlands University this past July. Following the clips, Sarah Crotzer and Malea Joyce, two Los Alamos Middle School students who attended Tech Trek, will share highlights of their experiences at the camp and answer questions about Tech Trek.

Next, two Los Alamos elementary school librarians, Julia Goen from Pinon and Jeff Lloyd from Aspen, will tell us how the schools used their funding from the Jean Nereson Books Memorial. So far,

each of the five elementary schools has received \$2000 from the memorial fund and will receive the same amount over the next two years.

Be sure to join us on Sept. 12 to learn firsthand about Tech Trek, a major AAUW national initiative to promote science and math careers to Middle School girls, and learn how our branch efforts to honor Jean Nereson are benefiting Los Alamos elementary school libraries. ISIS, the Middle East, and US Policy: Regional Reflections Since the Iran Agreement Dr. Emile Nakhleh Thursday, Sept. 17, 7-8 pm Fuller Lodge

On Thursday evening, we will join the League of Women Voters in co-sponsoring a talk by Dr. Emile Nakhleh, a retired Senior Intelligence Service Officer and Research Professor at UNM. Dr. Nakhleh will discuss the threat from ISIS, looking at the factors behind it as well as the challenges it poses to US Middle East policy, particularly in light of the recent Iran agreement. Mesa Prieta Petroglyph Tour, Friday, October 23, 9:30 am, \$25.

Katherine Wells, the Director and organizer, for the Mesa Prieta Petroglyph Project was the speaker for our tea this past May. Now on October 23 we will get to see the real thing including petroglyphs from the Archaic Period (before 1000 AD), the Puebloan Period (1200-1600 AD) and the Historic Period (1598 – present). The mesa contains an estimated 70,000 petroglyphs and is the largest site in New Mexico.

This will be a private tour, limited to 30 participants. Currently all three scheduled public tours for this fall are full. The tour cost is \$25 per person, begins at 9:30 am, lasts approximately two hours, and will be followed by lunch, TBA. The location is north of Espanola near Pilar. We will meet at the newly repaved United Church parking lot in Los Alamos at 8:30 am and 8:40 am at the White Rock "Y".

Please bring sunscreen, a hat, camera, water and sturdy walking shoes, as the trails are rough. If you have walking poles, you may wish to bring them. We will divide into smaller groups according to walking agility.
