


Legislative Preview Thursday, January 7, 7-9 pm Fuller Lodge

The Georgia O'Keeffe Museum and the New Mexico Museum of Art have joined forces to explore American Modernism, which is defined as art created at the beginning of the 20th century, the most creative and exciting seen up to that time. Before these exhibits leave, let's go see them! We'll begin at 10:30 am on Tuesday, January 5, at the O'Keeffe with a docent's remarks about the remarkable collection of paintings owned by the Vilcek Foundation, works by some of America's most original abstract painters. After a lunch break at Terra Cotta, we'll continue with our Santa Fe AAUW friend Kay Dorko as our docent at the Museum of Art's exhibit, highlighting photographs, watercolors, oils, and prints that attempt to establish a recognizable "American style" as well as with highlights of "O'Keeffe in Process." Admission to

both exhibits is \$12, but will be less if anyone is a member of either museum.
