Tech Trek NM 2020 Update

As many of you have heard, AAUW Tech Trek NM 2020 has been postponed until the summer of 2021, when we plan to hold one week of camp for Tech Trek NM 2020 and another for Tech Trek NM 2021.

In lieu of camp this summer, "Tech-Trek-in-a-Box" will be mailed the week of June 8 to all sixty campers. The effort is being led by Cheri Burch, Curriculum Coordinator. The boxes will be packed by the Albuquerque Branch STEM Task Force. It will include:

- String backpack with our Tech Trek NM logo imprinted,
- TI-84 Graphing Calculator
- Workshop instructions and supplies for five workshops (one per camp day),
- Ongoing NASA Cloud Observation Citizen Science activity, with the required tools included (Helena will collate the data),
- Suggested STEM activities for different museums, parks, and forests around NM,
- Online STEM activity ideas,
- Kindle with videos from the PBS series "Ask a Scientist" of women who are scientists in NM and the book "Women in Science: 50 Fearless Pioneers Who Changed the World" by Rachel Ignotofsky, and
- Graph of where the 2020 Trekkers are attending school this year, to encourage bonding and excitement between them.

Thanks to Honeywell and Facebook for allowing us to use their donations for camp this year to fund this extra project, as well as those of you who made uncommitted donations so we can fund these boxes.

Student services will inform the student body of this scholarship.

Finances will be managed by the UNM Foundation; all contributions are tax deductible and all contributions go directly to the student (the Foundation does not charge a management fee).

The university administration reports that there is a great need for a non-restrictive scholarship (no requirement as to major, marital status, nationality or NM residency).
