- Make an observation or ask a question. ...
- Gather background information. ...
- Create a hypothesis. ...
- Create a prediction and perform a test. ...
- Analyze the results and draw a conclusion. ...
- Share the conclusion or decide what question to ask next: Document the results of your experiment.

At a time still to be determined, we will visit a new show at the Maxwell Museum of Anthropology at UNM. "Nothing Left for Me: Federal Policy and the Photography of Milton Snow in Diné Bikéyah" looks at the brutal impact of the Navajo Livestock Reduction imposed upon Diné communities and homelands by U.S. Indian Commissioner John Collier starting in the 1930s. We will have a curator lead tour.

In October, our tiny group of 3 had a lovely day at Los Luceros. The small museum had information about the Pueblo culture that preceded the homestead era. Although the ranch house is closed for restoration, we visited the small chapel, a small residence, the orchard, fields and extensive acequia system bordered by century old cottonwoods. Sheep and donkeys grazed on the far fields. For centuries cultures have prospered





on the property due to its proximity to water. We will schedule another visit in the spring, after the ranch house reopens, to share this important



ecological and cultural jewel with our members.
