## Fruit Project 2024



Thanks to our generous members, the committee purchased 1660 pieces of fruit that were distributed into 112 decorated bags for Los Alamos families who registered for the LA Cares December food distribution. We surpassed our goal of \$1000 and received \$1065. Working with LA Cares, we qualified for their discount and spent \$772.20 (\$858 before the discount). The remaining funds, \$292.80, will

be given to LA Cares to purchase fruit for the February distribution.

Historically, this is our 11<sup>th</sup> year, as 2014 was the first year of the Fruit Project, when we filled 90 bags for \$660. The numbers of families in subsequent years are: 97,100,76,80,80,73,77,80,112.
