\*On March 14, Kirsten Bell, Chair of the **Leadership Los Alamos (LLA)** Board of Directors, talked about the program's history and impact in our county.

Since its founding in 2003, it has graduated over 350 leaders. Interestingly, almost three quarters of its graduates are women, so the program has had an outsized impact on women who live and/or work in Los Alamos. LLA is a 501(c)(3) organization run solely by volunteers.

Participants pay \$800 tuition for the 9-month program, though scholarships for up to \$400 are available. Among alumni are Kirsten herself, Christine Chandler, Carol Clark, Ryn Herrmann, and Anne Laurent. Participants must work or live in Los Alamos.

The program focuses on educating participants of the opportunities and needs of our community, helping them develop interpersonal relationships and a sense of esprit de corps, providing opportunities for hands-on leadership experience, and offering opportunities for interactions with current community leaders. In terms of the program's impact on women in our community, Kirsten felt it offered them networking opportunities and helped them build both self-confidence and a willingness to take risks.

As a side note, in discussions before her talk, Kirsten commented that she had grown up in Los Alamos. She was not only a friend of Helena's daughter, but remembered Helena as her girl scout leader, and remembered Karin Roberts as her kindergarten teacher in White Rock. It is a small world.
